Congressional Art Competition

Congressman Pete Sessions (TX-17) is pleased to announce a district wide art competition for high school students. **This year's theme is "Patriotism in America"**. The winner of the district competition will be honored by having their work displayed in the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C. along with artwork from across the United States. We will have four semi-final art competitions and the Semi-Finalist of each region will go on to the finals judged by Congressman himself. Semi-final Receptions

The **Waco reception** will consist of schools in the following **counties: McLennan, Falls, and Limestone.**

The **Round Rock reception** will consist of schools in the following **counties: Milam, Williamson, and Travis.**

The **Nacogdoches reception** will consist of schools in the following **counties: Houston, Trinity, Angelina, and Nacogdoches.**

The **Huntsville reception** will consist of schools in the following **counties: Freestone, Leon, Robertson, and Walker.**

April 21st: Nacogdoches Reception

April 22nd: Huntsville, Waco and Round Rock Reception

Eligibility:

Each student may submit no more than two pieces of artwork. The student must reside or attend school within the 17th Congressional District of Texas and currently enrolled in high school grades 9-12. They may only participate in one Congressional district art competition at a time. You may verify your congressional district by going to <http://house.gov> and entering your zip code.

Requirements:

- **Follow the theme “Patriotism in America”**
- Artwork must be two-dimensional
- Each piece can be **no larger than 26 inches by 26 inches to the outside dimensions of the frame.** No framed piece should weigh more than 15 pounds. **NOTE: MAXIMUM TOTAL SIZE ALLOWED IS 26” x 26”** – this is a national level rule; no exceptions!
- **MINIMUM TOTAL SIZE ALLOWED IS 12” x 12”**
- No more than 4 inches in depth
- All work must be matted and pre-wired ready for display
- Framing is not “required” for the district contest, but is preferred, except for oil paintings. The Framing Guidelines must be followed on all framed entries. (see below) The winning piece **MUST BE FRAMED** prior to being shipped to Washington, D.C. for display.

NOTE: The 1st place artwork will hang in the U.S. Capitol facility for the entire year of the exhibition and cannot be returned to students earlier. Students, therefore, should submit artwork they will not need for other purposes.

Artwork Categories:

- Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
- Drawings: pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink, markers; it is recommended that charcoal & pastel drawings be fixed
- Collage: must be two-dimensional
- Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
- Mixed media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, etc.
- Computer generated art
- Photography

Each entry must be ORIGINAL in concept, design, and execution and may not violate U. S. copyright laws. Any entry that has been copied from an existing photo or image (including a painting, graphic, or advertisement) that was created by someone other than the student is a violation of the competition rules and will not be accepted.

Work entered must be in the original medium (that is, not a scanned reproduction of a painting or drawing).

Suitability Guidelines:

The final decision regarding the suitability of all artwork for the district contest will be made by the District Director. While it is not the intent to censor any artwork, we do wish to avoid artwork that is potentially inappropriate for display at the District Art Competition.

Framing Guidelines:

- As directed by the House Oversight and Standards of Official Conduct Committees, *the **District winner is responsible for framing his or her own entry and Plexiglass must be used.*** Any hardship cases will be addressed on an individual basis.
- Plexiglass is better to use than glass over the artwork in order to avoid breakage during handling. *If regular glass is used for the district level competition, cost of repairing any damage will be at artist's own expense.*
- **All framed artwork should be no larger than 26 inches high, 26 inches wide, and 4 inches deep and no smaller than 12 inches high and 12 inches wide including the outside dimensions of the frame and no more than 15 pounds in weight. Please double check size before entering. Framed work larger than the specified dimensions will not be accepted.**
 - Frames should be kept as simple and sturdy as possible. Metal frames are recommended.
 - No “snap on” frames with glass are to be used
 - Matting can enhance or detract from a work of art and should be carefully prepared.
 - Use sturdy picture hangers. Two hooks should be attached at the right and the left sides of the in order to prevent the work from leaning forward or hanging unevenly.
 - Do not attach labels, ribbon, etc. to the front of the piece or underneath the glass or Plexiglass.
 - If the artwork is abstract in design, please indicate on the back side which side is up with arrows.

***The Participation Form must be filled out and returned to Congressman Sessions Waco office or by email to Tori.Magers@mail.house.gov as soon as you decide if your school will participate or no later than Monday, April 10.**

***A copy of the 2023 Student Release Form signed by the teacher, parent/guardian, and the student must be submitted with the artwork.**
