Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I respectfully request funding for the Basin 2B – Interceptor Sewer Line Replacement project in fiscal year 2027. The entity to receive this funding is the City of Woodway, Texas, located at 924 Estates Drive, Woodway, Texas 76712.

This \$3,000,000 request would be used to replace approximately 4,200 linear feet of aging interceptor sewer lines, including 18-inch, 15-inch, and 12-inch diameter pipe, along with replacement of associated manholes and adjustments to system elevations to improve flow conditions. The project will address significant inflow and infiltration (I&I) issues caused by aging infrastructure, including root intrusion and structural deterioration, which currently contribute to surcharging and increased risk of sewer overflows in the system.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will improve wastewater system reliability, reduce inflow and infiltration, and mitigate the risk of sanitary sewer overflows that can negatively impact water quality and public health. Replacing these critical interceptor segments will ensure the system operates efficiently and remains compliant with environmental standards while supporting continued service to the community.

This project has a federal nexus because it is for the purposes authorized in Title VI of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C 1381 et seq.
