I respectfully request funding for the Mass Casualty Training Facility in fiscal year 2026. The entity to receive this funding is the Sam Houston State University, located at 1806 Avenue J, Huntsville, Texas 77341.

The \$4,400,000 request will expand the leadership position of existing forensics research and training programs at Sam Houston State University by constructing a facility to conduct highly realistic trainings, utilizing human cadavers, for a variety of mass catastrophic disaster and recovery scenarios (fires, explosions, earthquakes, plane crashes, etc.). The project will dramatically expand the scope and impact of training efforts currently provided by SHSU and create a central training and workforce development platform to serve local, regional, state and national law enforcement, emergency and medical task forces, mass fatality response and search and rescue teams. This project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will be used to construct a first-of-its-kind training facility for law enforcement officials to improve mass disaster preparedness and planning for tactical operations and response teams.
