Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I respectfully request funding for the Bosque Water Pump Station, Storage, and Water Line Project in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive this funding is the City of Woodway, Texas, located at 922 Estates Drive, Woodway, TX 76712.

This project will provide 1 million gallons of ground storage, a pump station with a firm capacity of 1,500 GPM and a 12-inch water transmission line. These improvements will significantly benefit the operation of the Woodway water system and relieve the areas of the city low water pressures in this area of the city. This reuse project will supply treated effluent to businesses in the Waco Industrial Park for purposes for which drinking water is currently being used – for both irrigation and industrial purposes. Effluent will be treated before it is pumped into the system for reuse. The service area for this project will cover the entire Waco Industrial Park, which is approximately 3,600 acres and is home to over 50 manufacturers and commercial businesses. This project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will directly address the need for adequate water supply for commerce in Waco and free up critical additional drinking water supply for rural communities in Eastern McLennan County to more ably comply with Clean Water Act mandates. My community project funding request for this project is \$3,000,000.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by Section 1452 of the Safe Drinking Water Act, 42 U.S.C. 300j-12.
